Regular irrigation system maintenance and repair is one of the greatest opportunities to save water in the landscape. Many irrigation system





ach year, CLCA honors those who have made an exceptional impact on the association and the green industry. The 2022 awards were presented during the association's annual Leadership Conference, held in Sacramento January 24-25, 2023.

ALLEGIANCE AWARDS

In recognition of their years of service and leadership, CLCA presented Heath Bedal and Steve Jacobs with its Allegiance Award, the association's most prestigious honor.

The award is only given to a green industry professional who has been a member of the association for a minimum of 15 years and who has had a significant effect on the industry. Each of this year's receipients has served on at least three of the association's committees, task forces or boards for a total of 10 years. They are the driving force of many of the association's most innovative and substantial programs and efforts.

Heath Bedal

Heath's passion for the industry shows with his service within CLCA. He has served many roles within the association, including Co-Chair of the Chapter Presidents Council and Associate Member Director. He received the CLCA's Associate Member of the Year Award in 2003, the highest honor given to an associate member. At the time of his election, he became CLCA's first Associate Member President. Currently, he serves on the state Events Committee. He may be best known for his outstanding and energetic performances as CLCA Elvis, including his latest turn as Hawaiian CLCA Elvis at the 2021 CLCA Convention in Hawaii.

LEAF Awards \$42,500 in Scholarships to Nine Green Industry Students

eeking to promote and support the future of the green industry, the Landscape Educational Advancement Foundation (LEAF) has awarded nine scholarships totaling \$42,500. The scholarships ranged from \$800 to \$12,000.

In 2022, LEAF's scholarship selection committee reviewed 22 scholarship applications. Their selection criteria included career goals, outside activities, work experience, financial need, letters of recommendation, and GPA in their major.

The scholarships — the donations of CLCA members and other green industry professionals who fund them — have a huge, positive impact. We are honored to present the 2022 scholarship recipients below.

Applications for 2023 scholarships are now being accepted. Any student attending an accredited California community college or state university majoring in a landscaperelated program and taking a minimum of six units is eligible. The deadline to apply is April 17, 2023.

2022 LEAF Scholarship Recipients

Christopher Burroughs is a fourth-year recipient. He is presently attending San Diego State University, majoring in Environmental Sustainability. Chris is still involved in his non-profit organization, Garden 31 Community Initiative, where he provides training in the basics of the landscape industry. He hopes to create green spaces in parts of cities that lack trees and flowers to provide them with beauty and hope. He is dedicated to giving back to his community by teaching young men and women about landscaping, giving them solid work skills, and emphasizing the importance of having an attainable goal. He is appreciative of the support we have given him over the years.
